# SCENARIO

## LOGISTICS/JUDGES/CASUALTY SIMULATORS INFORMATION - Scenario # 4

**(BACKGROUND – NOT TO BE SHARED WITH COMPETITORS)**

**Scenario Location:** H Class Rooms

**Scenario Info:** Responders are called to the classrooms by a group of students who are worried about their arts and crafts teacher, who is “Taking A Nap”. Responders find Mrs.Sagger, a 25-year-old female who is currently 20 weeks pregnant, lying on the ground holding her head. **On site, a student in the class is trying to get the attention of the responders so they can attend to the patient. The student is unable to speak and requires a language card to communicate. Teacher becomes more responsive throughout scenario**

### **Scenario Set Up:**

- **Total number of patients:** 1 – Found on the ground in the classroom they were teaching in
- **Patient #1** – 20 weeks pregnant, stating the worst headache ever.
- **Scenario Props:** Arts and Crafts in room
- **First Aid Supplies Required:** FA Kit(s), Blankets, PCR’s
- **MFR Supplies:** Oxygen Kit(s)

### **Timing Notes:**

Team handout / Scenario background to be given BEFORE the beginning of the scenario as per instructions given by radio from Control.

**0 minutes** – Scenario BEGINS - “GO, GO, GO.”

**3 minutes** – for the end of the marking of “scene/primary survey”

**18 minutes** – 2 minutes remaining - for the team’s benefit.

**20 minutes** – Scenario ENDS. Teams are given **5 minutes** to complete the paperwork. **25 minutes** - Paperwork ENDS. Evaluators collect PCR immediately and ensure ALL boxes are completed. Initial debrief provided (5 minutes)

### **Judges Marking**

- items are scored as either **Completed** or **NOT COMPLETED** if Not **FULLY** completed.
- If teams continue to provide patient care (i.e.: finish tying a bandage, etc.) after time is called, that care will be counted as **NOT COMPLETED**.

## JUDGES/ CASUALTY INFORMATION

### Patient History Information –

You were teaching your students today when you started to have a headache and blacked out briefly. You (Mrs.Sagger) describe it as having the worst headache of your life before suddenly feeling extremely nauseous, light sensitivity, and dizzy, causing you to sit on the ground. The patient then seems to black out in front of the responders. **You initially blacked out, which is what caused your students to go and get help. You mention that you are supposed to visit your family doctor next week due to “proteins” being found in your urine before you “black out” again. The patient also reports no complaints regarding her pregnancy or the baby.**
